Confirmed Keynote speakers

Lene Tanggaard Pedersen is professor at Aalborg University, Denmark and co-director (with Svend Brinkmann) of the Center for Qualitative Studies. She has held visiting positions at Berkeley and the University of Technology, Sydney. Her research focuses on the situational and contextual dimensions of creativity vis-à-vis real-life problems. Recent publications include: Fornyelsens kunst (The art of change - creating creativity in schools), Copenhagen 2010; Towards an Epistemology of the Hand, Studies in Philosophy and Education, 29 (3): 243-257 (with S. Brinkmann, 2010); Apprenticeship re-habilitated in a postmodern world? Journal of Vocational Education and Training, 63 (4): 563-573 (with K. Nielsen); Stories about Creative Teaching and Productive Learning, European Journal of Teacher Education, 34 (2): 217-230 (both 2011).

Morwenna Griffiths holds the Chair of Classroom Learning in the Moray House School of Education at Edinburgh University. She has taught in primary schools, and at the University of Isfahan, Iran, at Christ Church College HE in Canterbury, and at Oxford Brookes, Nottingham and Nottingham Trent Universities. Her recent research has included philosophical theorizing and empirical investigation, related to epistemology of auto/biography, social justice, public spaces, the nature of practice, feminization and creativity. Her books include Action for Social Justice in Education: Fairly Different, Maidenhead 2003; Educational Research for Social Justice, and Feminisms and the Self: the Web of Identity, Buckingham 1998.

Confirmed Keynote speakers

Hasan Şimşek is a professor of educational administration and leadership. He is currently the vice president and provost at Bahçeşehir University in İstanbul. He has extensively published in national and international journals and book chapters in higher education, educational leadership, organizational change, planning and qualitative research. He is the author of several books such as "The War of Paradigms at the Edge of the 21st Century and Turkey in Chaos", "Total Quality Management: Theory, Principles, and Applications", and the co-author of "Qualitative Research Methods in Social Sciences" (the only textbook on this title in Turkish). He was invited to deliver keynote addresses at the JTET Conference (2008), the 18th and19th Educational Sciences Conferences (2009 and 2010; the largest educational event in Turkey), ENIRDELM Conference (2012).

Riel Miller, PhD (tbc) is one of the world's leading strategic foresight designers and practitioners. He worked as a senior manager in the Ontario public service (Ministries of Finance; Universities; and Industry) and for some thirteen years in total at the OECD in Paris (Directorates of Economics; Science and Technology; Education; Territorial Development; Development Centre; International Futures Programme). In 2005 he founded an independent consultancy xperidox (which means knowledge through experience) to advise clients on how to use the future more effectively. In June 2012, he took up the appointment as Head of Foresight for UNESCO in Paris.
